Oberle School Needs Used Bikes for Vocational Program

(Fredericksburg, VA) – Employment Resources Incorporated’s Gladys H. Oberle School in Fredericksburg is in need of used bicycles for their vocational program. The Oberle School’s *Wilson Center for Vocational Studies* accepts donated bicycles from local residents and utilizes them to train their students through their Bicycle Repair Program. “All of our bikes go through an extensive 11-point mechanical check and safety inspection which also includes cosmetic improvements such as painting and replacing old parts with new ones,” said Rob Welch, Vocational Director at the Gladys H. Oberle School.

“Once our students have completely refurbished the bicycles, we donate them to needy families and children in the area,” said Joan McLaughlin, President of Employment Resources Incorporated (ERI). ERI partners with local non-profit social service organizations that work with low-income families in the region for distribution of the bicycles.

Anyone who has used bicycles to donate to the vocational school program can drop them off at the Oberle School on Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:30am-2:00pm at 404 Willis Street, Fredericksburg.
